

CENSUS 2010

The U.S. 2010 Census has started.

In March, you will receive a census form either by mail or in person from a census worker. Head of household should complete and return their forms upon receipt.

It is important that we receive accurate census data that reflects changes in our township. Do you know that the federal government distributes more than \$400 billion annually to state, local and tribal governments based on census data? This is money for projects like new schools, senior centers, hospitals and other community facilities based on the census data. The census also determine boundaries for state and local legislative and congressional districts, plus determine the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives. The 2010 census form is one of the shortest in census forms history, only 10 questions. For more information, please visit the website at 2010census.gov.
